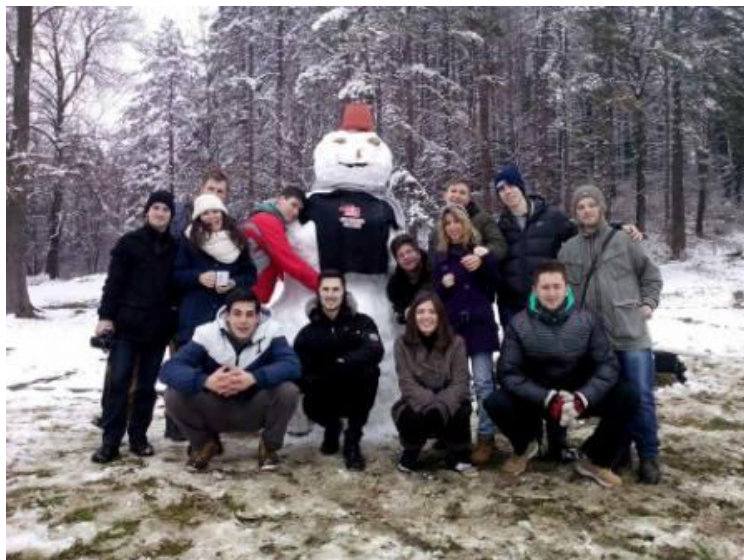


Dear Friends,

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ACTIVITIES OF ORC/HCA IN FEBRUARY 2015.

ORC TUZLA YOUTH GROUP

► Youth, modern art and social activism

From 20th till 22nd February 2015 in Sarajevo took place Civitas seminar “Youth, modern art and social activism”, 36 people from whole B&H participated on it. Aim of the seminar was to learn how through art and activity on social networks point out to problems in local community and how in a creative way contribute to their resolution. Beside workshops, participants had an assignment to choose a global problem manifested in B&H and to present its solution in a short play of five minutes.



Task for all groups was after seminar to make a recording of 60 seconds in which they will show how art can help solve problems in local community. All recordings will be participating in a competition “60 sec challenge” in which number of likes on facebook page will determine a winner, winners become mentors in Civitas summer school.

► Budapest study session



Haris Selmanovic, member of the ORC Tuzla youth group Tuzla has participated on a study session from 22nd February till 1st March organized by Organizing Bureau of European School Student Unions (OBESSU) and Europe council.

Session gathered 35 high school pupils, leaders of their pupil unions and organizations from Europe, along with Emir Zulehjcic colleagues from the managing board of the high school association B&H Haris has represented this organization.

Main topic of the session was xenophobia and development of the action plan with which member organizations of OBESSU will act on the elimination of xenophobia and hate speech from Europeans schools. Having in mind that B&H is only country with “two schools under the same roof” we hope that Emir and Haris were motivated during the session and that they will implement their knowledge in their work.

► Organized first module of Liberal academy B&H

In Tuzla was organized first module of liberal academy B&H in the Dramar center on 28th February 2015. It is a unique model of non-formal education based on liberal ideas, with the focus on economy liberalism. At the module participated 30 young people.

Education participants had the opportunity to listen about liberalism, and along with Admir Cavalic, lecturer and director of liberal academy debate on some actual liberal issues of today. Afterwards a workshop was organized on the topic of economy liberalism, with the debate on actual issues in Bosnia and Herzegovina. As a part of the debate there was a discussion on possible fiscal reforms in our country, significance of EU initiatives, and other demands of international institutions.



Liberal academy continues with activities during whole year, offering a chance to participants acquire enough points to obtain a diploma from mentioned academy through series of events. Aim of liberal academy is to educate and empower B&H economist liberals in order to start necessary liberal reforms in B&H.

► Team building activity

Delighted with their interest for the problems of public significance, we have offered them all needed help in the further realization of their project, we have suggested them directions and gave them advices in order to realize their project in a short time.

+ CREATIVE WORKSHOPS

Creative workshops continued in January. + LANGUAGE WORKSHOPS



Courses in English and German continued in January, 30 students currently enrolled in these courses are divided into three groups: (1 Starter, Starter 2 for children and adults and the middle one for children). Each group has two lessons a week for an hour and a half, and the classes are held in the premises of the Youth organizations Svitac and Youth Centre Brcko District. Age of students is from 8 to 35 years.

Interactive workshops of German language started again after the winter holiday. Workshops are really popular since they are free of charge, at the same time are well planned and for those who really want to learn are of great benefit. Currently there are 20 pupils age 18+. Workshops are taking place in Youth center on Monday and Wednesday from 20:00 till 21:00 hours. Workshop coordinators are international volunteers from Germany Nicolas Zdun and Tamara Wonner.

SPORT WORKSHOPS

Sports workshops are held three times a week in the Youth Center Brcko District. The number of participants varies up to 40, ages 6+. Some of the activities are football, the game "Dodgeball", volleyball, freezes. etc. Participants, especially the boys are delighted sports workshops, so you can always find extra fun with the ball or just enjoying the team games. 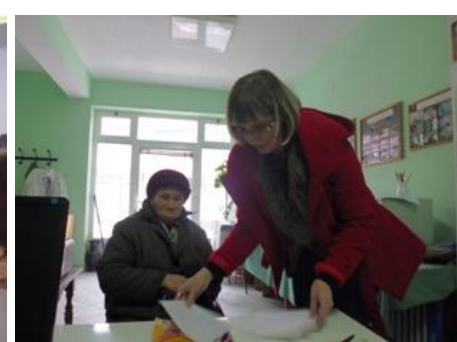

✚ PRONI at the meeting with the Hungarian parliament representatives



PRONI Centre on Friday, 20th February 2015 participated in a meeting with Hungarian parliament representatives that within the Twinning project "Capacity building of parliament in Bosnia and Herzegovina in the context of EU integration" are work towards increasing the participation of civil society and the visibility of the role of parliaments in the EU integration process. The aim of the meeting held in the Assembly of Brcko District of B&H, is for the representatives and experts of the project from Hungary was familiar to business as usual and cooperation between the Legislative and executive authorities with civil society organizations in Brcko with a special focus on EU

integration. The involvement of citizens and civil society in these processes provides an opportunity for a more realistic process of drafting laws and better connect with friends, and with you, and increased legitimacy for activities parliaments at all levels of government. PRONI in this meeting stressed their commitment to youth and systematic solution of youth issues in Brcko through the initiative for the adoption and implementation of the Law on Youth of Brcko District of B&H, the Law on Volunteering, creating adequate space for young people through the network of youth clubs and initiating youth center. When presenting our center we outlined our work on the process of reconciliation and cooperation with State and Entity authorities in addition to cooperation with the Parliament and the Government of Brcko District of B&H. The project aims at strengthening the role of the Parliamentary Assembly of B&H, FB&H parliament, the National Assembly of the Republic of Serbska and the Brcko District Assembly in the process of accession of Bosnia and Herzegovina to the European Union and the implementation of the Stabilization and Association Agreement. The purpose of the project is to strengthen the capacity of MPs and parliamentary administration for strategic process of joining the EU.

As an organization that works with all levels of government in Bosnia and Herzegovina and has partners outside of B&H in order to improve the situation of young we are very interested in the project objectives, the recommendations that will result from these meetings and participation of young people in parliaments

✚ Young people of Brcko District B&H at coffee with decision makers

Within the project **stand up and get lucky** PRONI Centre with partners organizes coffee with decision makers in ten cities of Bosnia and Herzegovina, among other in the Brcko District of B&H.

Coffee with the decision-makers is a special event for young people and decisions makers in Brcko District of B&H. Young people will through discussion with the decision makers have the opportunity to provide constructive suggestions for improving the work with young people in Brcko.

Guest of the first "Coffee with the decision makers," the head of the technical and administrative affairs Mr.



Tomislav Stjepanovic and other Mr. Damir Bulcevic head of the economic development, sports and culture.

Young spoke about a number of different issues that they consider important for the improvement of work with young people in the Brcko District of B&H. Questions of internship and ways of dealing with issues of interns with a university degree, so that young people establish a better dialogue with the individual departments of the Government of Brcko District of B&H, issues to support young talented people, issues of making law on young people and the law on volunteering, and how the government is working revision of spent funds by individual departments, but the effect of using the funds especially those intended for young people. In addition to all this, young people are given and suggestions that part internship and volunteering can solve the current labor law, but also to the future law on volunteering. Young and bosses have supported the initiative of this kind of exercise of dialogue between young people and government, and PRONI will continue to call other heads of departments to themselves meet with young people in this way.

Please note that the call for Coffee with decision makers was open to all young people in the Brcko District of Bosnia and Herzegovina from 15 to 30 years, regardless of whether they are active in some associations or not. In the past coffees in the group of young people were young people from the so-called. groups "since interns", students from technical schools, youth activists, youth organizations Firefly, volunteers from the Youth Clubs of Brcko District of B&H and others.



Stand up and get lucky project aims to empower young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina to identify key problems caused by the political situation and influence on resolving these issues by raising citizens' awareness and promoting a culture of democratic participation in the community.

This project is being implemented with the help of ten organizations from ten cities / municipalities in Bosnia and Herzegovina: Visoko, Gorazde, Sarajevo, Mostar, Tuzla, Banja Luka, Foca, Brcko, Doboij and Travnik. The project with partners implemented by Association "Young volunteers" high with partners, and funded by the Royal Norwegian Embassy in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

17th February 2015 PRONI Center Bijeljina, as a member of the Youth Council of Bijeljina, attended the meeting with the Head of Social Services, Slavko Basic, in order to inform about the new mode of financing of non-governmental, youth organizations and youth organizations in Bijeljina.

The city administration wants to improve work by introducing new methods of financing organizations through projects, by making the individual to declare for the organization of general interest and through project grants fund them

annually. In this way the City Bijeljina recognizes the work of organizations working in Bijeljina for young people for many years and has good results of their work.

he meeting was held at the Cultural Center of Bijeljina, where the Youth Council of the town of Bijeljina is located.

Youth Council Bijeljina is an association of youth organizations Bijeljina consisting of young people with clear and transparent attitudes and ideas. We represent the interests of young people youth organizations from the town of Bijeljina and contribute to the development of youth policy by focusing on specific youth work and cooperation with youth organizations.

+ PRONI hosting a volunteer from Kingdom of Norway



PRONI Center for Youth Development currently has a volunteer from Norway. Norwegian student Jørgen Wien will spend five months in Brcko in PRONI as a volunteer. His work in PRONI Center and stay in Brcko District is part of his master's thesis in the field of anthropology, which is the main theme of reconciliation among young people. The idea of the project is to explore the issues of reconciliation and co-existence of youth in Brcko district B&H through direct work with young people. The project will be in addition to research on the opinions and attitudes of young

adults recorded on the reconciliation process and the example of Brcko district B&H, and through concrete actions to work on the exchange of culture between Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Kingdom of Norway. In PRONI Center most of the work for Jørgen will be research and Norwegian language course in order to contribute to young people and citizens of Brcko district B&H to meet the Norwegian culture and language. In addition he will be helping in other current activities of PRONI Center. Jorgen learned the languages of Bosnia and Herzegovina at the Balkan studies in Oslo, and leisure and there doing volunteer work with asylum seekers, immigrants and other immigrants in Norway. With them also worked attend Norwegian language and helped them get to know the culture of the country they have come.

+ Volunteers of Brcko and Bijeljina in Volunteering network

From 24th till 25th February in Banja Luka took place a meeting of the Volunteering network organized by the OKC. The meeting was part of the project "Volunteers make a change" which was attended by about 15 representatives of local voluntary services, including LVS Brcko and Bijeljina LVS. The meeting summed up the current operation of the network, discussed the possibilities for engagement and animation of volunteers, the minimum standards that are necessary for the existence of LVS as well as planning future activities of the network.

KULT INSTITUTE FOR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

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+ We provide support for the young people who wish to start a business and become independent

On 26th February 2015, a ceremony of awarding grants for youth entrepreneurship was held in the educational-leisure center SPAJALICA in Ilidza. For the occasion, the expert commission of the Institute for Youth Development KULT selected the Youth Association REaktiv from Zenica and the Tuzla Community Foundation from Tuzla as the organizations that rightfully earned their grants.

A year ago, the Institute, in collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Culture and Sports, conducted a grand-scale research on the position of the youth in FB&H. A thorough research showed that 70% of youth believe that business training may be beneficial for them in practice. Unfortunately, the research showed that only 16% of young people had a chance to participate in such training. Also, over 50% of young people emphasized that they would start their own business if they had a support to do so. The support need not be primarily financial but it also has to be advisory. That is why the initiative aims to support the young people and to encourage them to think as entrepreneurs in order to start their own business.



Another focus is to make the youth centers sustainable and more independent. We wish to demonstrate additionally to the youth centers that they can act as fund-raising initiators in order to create their own sustainability and independence in the easiest way and work on creating their own businesses that primarily have to be self-sustainable in the local community and in B&H, as was additionally emphasized by Jasmin Besic, the executive director of the Institute for Youth Development KULT.

As a part of the training for expert associates who would work with young people conducted by the Institute for Youth Development KULT and based on a call to deliver a business plan that will be realized as a part of the training, the Institute Commission selected the businesses that will be granted the support for realization of their business plan in individual amounts of up to 6000.00 BAM.

“Today there was a ceremony of signing the Contracts for grant realizations in Zenica and Tuzla. Awarding the grants was supported by the American Embassy in Sarajevo through the project of supporting the employability of youth workers in local communities. Until now, 24 youth workers from 12 local communities in B&H had the opportunity to participate in entrepreneurship training. The fundamental criteria for selecting a business plan were self-sustainability, the support from the local community and the need for that type of business in the local community, as was underlined by Rejan Roic, the project coordinator of the Institute.”



✚ Almir Mukaca : „ After many years of work success comes overnight “

Guest of the session "Coffee with" in the Educational-recreational Center SPAJALICA on Monday night was Almir Mukaca, a man who has a lot of life's priorities, projects and visions, but says he was just a farmer. The only difference lies in the fact that Almir and his entire team focused exclusively on organic production of vegetables. This is why Almir in SPAJALICA talked about healthy eating, organic production and projects such as "www.krompir.ba" and "grocery store," which is successfully running.



„My family has always been engaged in organic production of vegetables, but we know that it is so called, because that term in Fojnica, the area from which I come is not very used. We never use pesticides and chemical fertilizers in the cultivation of our vegetables because we produced exclusively for their own needs and we wanted to eat healthy foods. The idea to start www.krompir.ba came one Friday when I realized that I need to sell organic potatoes, which I delivered to the address primarily friends in Sarajevo. We realized that all we need to squeeze in and just then the idea was born for "grocery store," ie. A box full of vegetables ", said Almir during his tour in SPAJALICA.

✚ Regional conference in Banja Luka

In Banja Luka, on 13th February 2015, was organized second regional conference which was attended by officers, youth representative's non-governmental organizations that deal with youth issues, representatives / youth councils / youth councils. Regional conference in Banja Luka promoted the conclusions of the international conference of young people, to mark the 100th anniversary of the beginning of World War I, on which were 120 young people from 22 different countries in Sarajevo in June and July 2014. Young people believe that the most important elements for young people in the world today: active citizenship, international cooperation and overcoming ethnic barriers in order to prevent new conflicts, and promote the building of sustainable peace.

At the regional conference of Young Europe in Banja Luka participants were addressed by Mr. Vladimir Pandurevic, head of the EU Delegation to B&H, Mr. Jens Wagner in front of the German Embassy in B&H, President of the Youth Council of the Republic of Serbian (OSRS) Milos Blagojevic, who presented the activities OSRS, and a representative of the Institute Neyra Neimarlija Roic.

The European Union for the celebration of the 100th anniversary of the beginning of World War I gave support in the amount of 2 million euros.



To mark this anniversary is to put focus on what unites us, not what divides us, what's the point of the Sarajevo in 2014 supported by the European Union.

In April there will be a third and final regional conference in Tuzla. After the conference the conclusions of all three regional conferences will be consolidated and promoted, and that may serve as recommendations to government and NGO engagement for the benefit of young people.

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PROJEKT: 'VIEWS'

In February, began broadcasting videos as part of a project called "Views".

"Views" is a project that aims to report on the problems faced by young people but also other residents of 35 cities in B&H, all via video. Videos are creations of activists of the Youth Press Association, and are the product of the will for positive change through volunteerism. Recording and editing video cost 0KM.

A problem presented in the first episode reported by our volunteers from Cazin. Old cazinska High school is located in a very bad condition, for what is to blame negligence competent. Today, the school building was abandoned, in a dilapidated condition and used for garbage disposal and as a shelter for the homeless.

Unfortunately, this example sends a picture of neglect of local authorities, which no action is taken on the issue of restoration of the building, which could be used in a variety of positive purposes.

The problem introduced in the second episode comes from the capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina - Sarajevo. This example compromising the safety of pedestrians is not common only presented venue operations (Grbavica), but for the entire city. The fact that the video material is not made in one or two occasions, speaks and ironic that on the famous Google Maps website to view the Earth can see a car parked in the same place.

Pedestrians are forced to walk on August, because the sidewalk, which is intended for the safe passage of pedestrians, overcrowded vehicles and during times when the greatest number of people moving precisely this relation. Makes the situation worse and the constant passage of buses, and the maneuvering between the cars that are parked and cars and buses passing August even life threatening

The biggest problem in this story represents the negligence of persons responsible for law enforcement and traffic regulation (policemen and women), whose station is located a few hundred meters from the disputed site.

Priorities for the Embassy Fund for 2015 are activities to promote:

- Peace and reconciliation by means of culture and art, sport, employment, education or other activities.
- Democratization, independent media and freedom of speech.
- Judicial reform, including the fight against corruption.
- Reform of the security sector and defense.
- Economic development and job creation.
- Ethnic minorities, children, the disabled, young people and women are particularly important target group.
- Clean energy and climate adaptation.

It should be noted the following:

- Gender equality must be included in all projects and activities.
- The level of volunteerism should be included in the project activities.
- Nepotism in the hiring process will not be tolerated.

The fund Embassy usually gives assistance to projects that last more than one year and not exceeding 100,000 KM. If approved, the preparation of the contract in two copies. Both copies of the Agreement signed by the person authorized to act on behalf of recipients of grants. One copy for the grant recipient and the other is sent to the Embassy. There is a possibility that the Royal Norwegian Embassy in Sarajevo pays an agreed amount in KM in two installments if activities extend for a period of 12 months.
